

# CIC-ATOS MEMBERSHIP

### THE ORGANIZATION

#### **ATOS**

Founded in 1955, the American Theatre Organ Society (ATOS) is dedicated to the preservation and presentation of a uniquely American musical instrument—the theatre pipe organ, which was originally used to accompany silent films.

Today, the theatre pipe organ has evolved to a marvelous means of presenting popular music from the Broadway stage, movie scores, and music from the American Songbook to the concert-going public, as well as continuing to accompany silent films.

#### **CICATOS**

The largest chapters of some 70 that comprise ATOS, the CICATOS has over 300 members of all ages from all walks of life. Many want to learn to play the instrument, but most are avid listeners while some enjoy learning to work on these mechanical marvels to keep them in top shape. All are welcome! We all share the passion to keep these remarkable rare instruments playing.

Each year, CICATOS sponsors several public concerts in various area venues, bringing the finest internationally recognized theatre pipe organists to the Indianapolis community.

Members are also invited to attend an exciting annual ATOS convention of four or five days in mid-summer, comprised of numerous theatre pipe organs concerts, educational seminars giving tips on playing the instrument and other related topics. These events are staged in metropolitan areas around the country having restored instruments in beautiful old theatres and other public and private facilities. The top organists from around the world are on hand to play these concerts and present the seminars, with the annual ATOS business meeting also taking place.
